WELCOME TO THE INAUGURAL HETERODOX SOCIAL SCIENCE CONFERENCE.

We are entering a post-progressive era in which sixty years of cultural left intellectual hegemony is in question. Populism, polarization, progressive illiberalism and the fraying of social capital have produced an intellectual crisis and loss of confidence in our progressive-dominated meaning-making institutions. Traditional leftists, classical liberals and conservatives have all rendered pointed critiques of the cultural left episteme. A shift away from 'woke' excess is evident in new media, social media and even established media and organizations, but is being steadfastly resisted in academia.

Even so, academic research is vital for building theories which frame, organize and systematize smaller-scale insights from think tanks, the media and empirical scholars. We need high theory and intellectual depth alongside analysis and commentary. This requires networks, conferences, journals, associations, canonical texts, graduate programmes and courses. This conference is both an intellectual and an organizational endeavour.

The conference addresses a major problem: our knowledge-production system is heavily swayed by its cultural left weltanschauung, directing attention to progressive topics and viewpoints while using carrots and sticks to constrain the pursuit of truth. As a result, today's social science conceals as much as it reveals about the world.

The conference's intellectual aims are twofold: a) to institutionalize the study of woke, arguably a dominant high-cultural ideology of our episteme; and b) to research omitted topics and perspectives, rebalancing social scientific knowledge.

We need a New Social Science for an emerging post-progressive era.

TRAVEL

Conference venue: The Vinson Centre, University of Buckingham, Hunter Street, Buckingham, MK18 1EG, England

For international guests: All guests travelling to the United Kingdom from abroad are required to obtain an <u>Electronic Travel Authorisation (ETA)</u>. Everyone travelling needs to get an ETA, including babies and children. You can apply for this through the UK ETA app, available for <u>iOS</u> and <u>Android</u>. The application takes up to 3 working days to process and costs £16. If you would like to get this reimbursed, please send your receipt and payment details to Charlie (<u>charlie-downes@touchpointstrategy.co.uk</u>).

After you touch down: For simplicity and convenience, we recommend that attendees arriving at Heathrow, Gatwick, or Luton use Uber or share a car with fellow attendees. This is often faster and more direct than navigating multiple train transfers. If you'd like help coordinating ride-shares with other guests arriving at similar times, please reach out to Charlie at charlie-downes@touchpointstrategy.co.uk.

If you prefer to travel by train, here are the steps: From Heathrow:

- Train from Heathrow Terminal 5 to London Paddington
- Tube from Paddington to Euston Square (Circle or Hammersmith & City Line), then a short walk to London Euston
- Train from London Euston to Milton Keynes Central
- Taxi/Uber from Milton Keynes Central to the conference venue (13 miles)

From Gatwick:

- Train to London Victoria
- Tube from Victoria to Euston (Victoria Line)
- Train from London Euston to Milton Keynes Central
- Taxi/Uber to the venue

We recommend using <u>Trainline</u> to purchase your train tickets. You will need to collect your tickets from a ticket terminal or desk using the code provided on Trainline after purchase.

When returning to Milton Keynes Central from the conference venue, you will need to use a local taxi firm, as listed below. Be sure to keep at least £50 cash on you in case your taxi does not accept card payment.

If you are travelling by car, there is a car park onsite. The Vinson Centre also has ample parking in the Island car park, situated next to it (postcode MK18 1EG).


